

Adray Playoffs Metro Pee Wee

The format for the Adray State Playoffs this year will be a two game elimination tournament. We will also hold a Metro Championship to provide more opportunity for the players to succeed.

Adray Metro Championship

Top Four teams in each division will be competing for two opportunities to represent Metro in the Adray State Playoffs. It will be a double elimination tournament for those teams with seating being determined by the following criteria:

1. Winning Percentage
2. Goals Against
3. Goal Differential

Home Team:

The higher seat will have the first option for a home game but if they do not have ice available then the lower seat can provide the ice. If either team does not have ice available then you will work together to arrange an ice sheet that fit the playoff criteria. This process will be in place for games leading up to the semi final round and cost will be split between both teams. The semi and championship rounds games will be played on neutral ice.

Period Length:

9 minute stop time

Tie Procedure:

1. A Shootout consisting of (5) players from each team alternately taking penalty shots. A coin toss will determine which team will shoot first. The teams will shoot until time runs out.
2. A coin toss

Metro Championship

The next Four teams in each division will be competing for the Metro Championship. It will run as a three game point based tournament determined by the following criteria.

Seating:

1. Winning Percentage
2. Goals Against
3. Goal Differential

Format:

We will use the point system format for deciding which two teams play for the championship. Each period is worth one point, and the game is worth 2 points, for a total of 5 possible points. The team that scores the most goals in a period wins the period and one point. If each team

scores the same number of goals or no goals in a period, then each team gets a 1/2 point. The winner of the game gets 2 points. If the game is tied, then each team gets one point.

Example:

Team A playing team B. After the first period, the score is 1 to 0, team A having scored the goal. Team A gets 1 point and B gets nothing. After 2 periods, the score is still 1 to 0. Team A gets 1/2 point and team B gets 1/2 point. If after 3 periods, the score is 2 to 1, with team A scoring a goal and Team B scoring a goal, then Team A gets a 1/2 point for the period and team B gets a 1/2 point. Team A will also get 2 points for the win, so in the end Team A has 4 points and team B has 1 point.

Metro Championship Tier 2

The next three teams in each division will be competing for the Metro Championship Tier 2. It will run as a three game point based tournament determined by the following criteria.

Seating:

1. Winning Percentage
2. Goals Against
3. Goal Differential

Format:

We will use the point system format for deciding which two teams play for the championship. Each period is worth one point, and the game is worth 2 points, for a total of 5 possible points. The team that scores the most goals in a period wins the period and one point. If each team scores the same number of goals or no goals in a period, then each team gets a 1/2 point. The winner of the game gets 2 points. If the game is tied, then each team gets one point.

Example:

Team A playing team B. After the first period, the score is 1 to 0, team A having scored the goal. Team A gets 1 point and B gets nothing. After 2 periods, the score is still 1 to 0. Team A gets 1/2 point and team B gets 1/2 point. If after 3 periods, the score is 2 to 1, with team A scoring a goal and Team B scoring a goal, then Team A gets a 1/2 point for the period and team B gets a 1/2 point. Team A will also get 2 points for the win, so in the end Team A has 4 points and team B has 1 point.

Game Time Frames:

All Round Games Due Date 3/1/08

All Championship Games

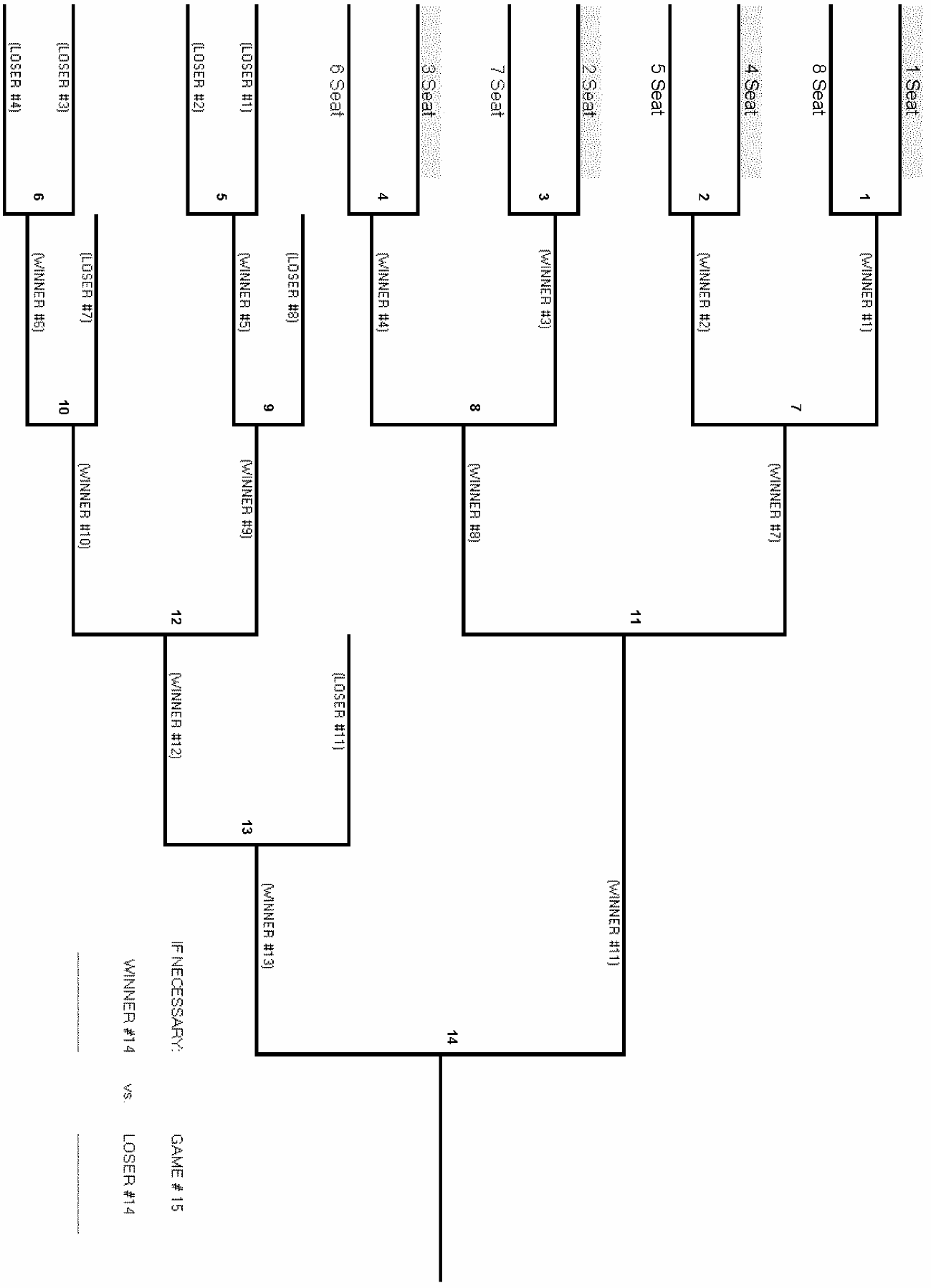
These costs will be determined by an average of all of the participating rinks. This year the average cost was \$357. The amount will be paid to the team hosting the ice. The referee fees will be split at the time of the game. The hosting team is responsible for booking the referees.

The length of periods will be 12 minute stop time for semi final and final games.

Tie Procedure:

1. (5) minute sudden death overtime period will be played. The teams will not change ends.
2. A Shootout consisting of (5) players from each team alternately taking penalty shots. A coin toss will determine which team will shoot first. If after (5) players from both teams have completed the procedure, the tie has not been broken, it shall be repeated with a different player from those that have already shot until time runs out.
3. A coin toss
