## Prep Division Guidelines and Information for the Fall 2023-2024 Season

- Team membership into the Prep Division is obtained through this registration process and will be reviewed for acceptance by the Adray Prep Division Committee.
- All teams will be comprised of student athletes that attend the same high school or a high school within the same school district. In addition, we follow all MAHA/USA Hockey Rules.
- Rosters will be comprised of freshmen, sophomores, juniors and a maximum of up to 4 skaters and one goalie that are seniors. (8th grade students are not eligible for this league). The Midget "out of District" rules do not apply to our league.
- Players that participate at the Varsity level will be allowed, but there will be a maximum of 2 former year Varsity players per team. Current year Varsity players are ineligible to play in the league per MAHA and USA hockey rules.
- Prep League teams will register with MAHA and follow the USA Hockey rules of play.
- A "Kickoff Meeting" will be scheduled in early August prior to the start of the Prep League season. All teams that have been accepted into the Prep League must be represented at this meeting.
- Playoff Eligibility:
  - 1. Players must be on the roster as of 12/31/2023 and must have played in at least 10 regular season games (tracked via Gamesheet).
    - If a player is injured, they can be marked as such on Gamesheet.
  - 2. Players may not return for Adray games (regular season or playoffs) upon the completion of their varsity season. Those players may only return for Spring or later.
  - 3. Players will be required to check in when arriving at their playoff games.
    - Players must present a valid form of identification.
    - For players who drive, this can include a valid Michigan driver's license.
    - For players who do not drive, they may use a current school ID.
  - 4. Players who do not have valid ID will not be able to participate in that game.



### **Post Season**

The teams will be broken into Championship brackets. These Championship brackets will be determined by winning percentage based on the following criteria.

Seating:

- 1. Winning Percentage
- 2. Head-to-Head
- 3. Goals Against
- 4. Goal Differential

Semi:

We will be re-seeding the playoffs after the Post Season based upon the results of these games for the Semifinal.

Home Team:

The home teams will be the 1 and 2 seed after re-seeding has taken place. They will be the host of the Semi Final games and the away team is responsible for the cost of the officials for those games. The higher seed will be the home team for the Championship game.

Game Time Frames:

Prep/Midget's -The length of periods will be 15-minute stop time.

All Semifinal Game Sheets:

Prep/Midget's -1 hr. and 30 min

Playoff Eligibility:

Players must be on the roster as of 12/31/2023 and must have played in at least 10 regular season games (tracked via GameSheet).

• If a player is injured, they can be marked as such on GameSheet.

Players may not return for Adray games (regular season or playoffs) upon the completion of their varsity season. Those players may only return for Spring or later.

Players will be required to check in when arriving at their playoff games.

- Players must present a valid form of identification.

### Championship/Semi Final Tie Breaker System

Tie Procedure:

- 4 player 5 Minute sudden death overtime period will be played provided there is more than (8) minutes left on the curfew clock. The teams will not change ends.
- 2. A Shootout consisting of (5) players from each team alternately taking penalty shots. A coin toss will determine which team will shoot first. If after (5) players from both teams have completed the procedure, the tie has not been broken. The process will continue in a sudden death mode with one shooter from each team other than those that have already participated until the ice time runs out. Each team will be given an opportunity to shoot in each of the sudden death rounds.
- 3. A coin toss.
